






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ITINERARY TO ADVENTURE ...

DAY 1 - JUNEAU July 26

Services start today. We transfer from the hotel to Juneau Port (Julia will suggest a hotel in Juneau. Pre tour accommodation is not included. Transfer is included this morning.) We board the Delphinus II this morning - the adventure begins! Times will be re-confirmed by your WPA guide the night before. We meet our skipper and crew and after an orientation aboard Delphinus II, we depart for the wilds of Alaska! There may be orcas and whales on the journey! Our itinerary is flexible to target the most recent information of the best nature in the region. We are likely to start with the Stephens Passage and Holkham Bay, Endicott Arm and the Ice Kingdom. This region is a very active place and the home to much wildlife–humpbacks, black and brown bears, river otters, harbour seals pupping on the ice pans, and large flocks of scoters and other birds. DAY 2 - ALASKA WILDERNESS

July 27

Today we spend more time in Endicott Arm. Travel to Seymour Canal and possibly Pleasant Bay for the night. The itinerary is open and depends on nature experiences and conditions. Your skipper and crew will use years of experience to maximise your comfort and enjoyment of this stunning wilderness region. (B,L,D)

DAY's 3/4 - ALASKA WILDERNESS July 28/29

Pack Creek is the best known bear reserve in Southeast, and well it should be. It is only a very small part of Admiralty Island, and an even less significant part of Alaska as a whole. Yet it is here we have one of the best chances for watching brown bears truly be bears (when the salmon are in). The bears will probably ignore us, as people are and have been a constant their entire lives. Here, again, there is much more than bears. We once saw a white raven and several species of gulls and many eagles are attracted by the wealth of salmon. Windfall Harbour right next door, is also worthy of a visit and this trip will do so. We will depart in the early evening for our nightly anchorage. (B,L,D)





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DAY's 5/6 - ALASKA WILDERNESS

July 30/31

The next few days will be spent with the whales of Frederick Sound, numerous actively feeding humpbacks, occasional orcas and common bow-riding Dall's porpoise. This is the centre of a large number–sometimes in the hundreds–of summer time feeding humpbacks. This is the same population that goes to Hawaii in the winter for breeding and calving. There are also other marine mammals including Steller sea lion rookeries and harbour seals. Both of these are sometimes the food of the so-called transient orcas. Resident (fish eating) orcas also regularly use the area, so you need to always be on the look out for these exciting animals. You will also go ashore in some jewel-like temperate rain forest settings. Perhaps most importantly, you will have time to get lost in your own thoughts, feelings, and photography. (B,L,D)

DAY 7 - ALASKA WILDERNESS

August 1

A continuation of Frederick Sound with many options. As always our goal is to put you in the place of maximum opportunity and to emphasize the things that most interest you. There are weeks and weeks– even a life-time–of opportunities here. You are moving out of Frederick Sound now, heading further south past Petersburg (a small fishing town with strong Norwegian heritage), the Wrangell Narrows (a major shipping lane and bottleneck due to its narrowness and numerous hazards), the town of Wrangell and the narrow passage between Wrangell Island and the mainland. We will probably anchor and spend the night in Berg Bay with possibilities to go ashore. (B,L,D)

DAY 8 - ALASKA WILDERNESS

August 2

Early in the morning we will depart our anchorage and arrive at the Anan Creek bear reserve. This is a special place, even without the bears. It provides a bay, lagoon, reversing waterfalls, a walk through an old growth temperate rain forest, stream, more water falls, and a bear observatory/photo blind. The observatory is located above the falls and provides a bit of shelter in case of rain. You can watch the bears at the falls below you, in the stream, and often beside you as the bears move between the creek, falls, and surrounding forest. The photo blind is located right at the level of the falls, eye to eye with the bears. It is available for 30-minute periods by signing up when reaching the observatory. The stream itself is full of migrating salmon that are the central link in the story of the energy cycle of Southeast Alaska. In the evening, we will start back to Wrangell. (B,L,D)





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DAY 9 - WRANGELL - tour ends August 3

This may be the last day, but it is a very busy and exciting one. We start to cruise to Wrangell. Again, fantastic scenery and nature. One last surprise fast boat adventure up the Stikine River. We say surprise as it is different and guarantees you new and imagery and experiences. Look out for moose! We arrive in port and the end of our adventures. We suggest that you overnight in Juneau before continuing your journey as we can not guarantee an arrival time and linking your flight. In port, we say goodbye to Ronn and the crew. Extra accommodation can be booked as close as next to the arrival jetty - the Stikine Inn.

(B,L,D) - Confirms if Breakfast - Lunch - Dinner - are included that day. Itinerary and price is subject to change.

THE DELPHINUS II

The Delphinus II is a refurbished vessel that is customised to offer unique small group wilderness cruising experiences - this is rare in Alaska and so different to the huge cruise ship experience. The Delphinus II can explore locations that the larger ships can only dream about. Cabins are small and serve as sleeping quarters only. It is the rest of the ship that you will love for deck space, 360 degree shooting and the mixed opportunities of sitting with the skipper (he can answer all questions...) to watching the wilderness, to going on the higher deck for unobstructed viewing. We have sailed with skipper Ronn and his team several times and can say you are in for a special wilderness adventure with one of the most experienced teams in all of North America!

RONN PATTERSON - OWNER/CAPTAIN OF DELPHINUS II

Ronn Patterson is a naturalist by profession, a marine biologist by training, a student of whales by practice, a professional photographer by habit, a teacher by inclination, and a writer by requirement. For over thirty years he has led natural history trips to such places as Africa, the Amazon, the Andes, Baja California and Mexico, the Galapagos, and Alaska. Ronn founded the Natural Environmental Studies Program for the University of California Extension at Berkeley. During the fourteen years he directed that program, he also directed biology instruction and founded and directed the UC Extension Photography Program. He has also been a whale consultant and biologist for the U.S. Government as well as a delegate to and member of the Scientific Committee of the International Whaling Commission.

PRE TOUR

Accommodation, and services start for this tour - DAY 1 in Juneau. All travel services before this are not included. We suggest that you arrive in Juneau at least 48 hours before this tour starts. This timing will give you a chance to relax and acclimatise to the new time zone. We generally commence booking pre/ post tour accommodation/flights about 8/9 months before departure.

NOTE: This itinerary is flexible to allow your guides to maximise your photo and travel interests to weather and unique opportunities. Specific targeted subjects will be offered the night before departure each day. This will offer you 'the best of the region'. Meals not included in the itinerary, are organised to 'fit in' with the days shoots.

FINAL ITINERARY

Note that a final itinerary will be sent to you about one month before departure. This document also includes further tips like clothes. You can contact Darran earlier for more assistance.

IMPORTANT

To make sure you book the correct dates and times, we would request the following:

1. Don't purchase any air tickets, until our guides flights have been booked, which we will do approximately 8 - 9 months prior to the tour departure. We will advise you when the guides flights are booked and you can then use this itinerary, to help you use points or similar. This will also coincide with confirming the tour departure, making sure we have met minimum passenger numbers for the tour and the logistics of the tour have not changed.

2. We suggest you arrive a minimum of 24 hours prior to the tour departure - even 48 hours - to help with jet lag and in case of airline delays.
